Mothers home

We have established residential and counselling services to women facing unplanned pregnancies. Most of these women/teenagers fell pregnant due to rape. Within our mothers home they are provided with safe residential care, love, counselling services as well as medical care to enable them to start a new life.



Youth services

NORSA has established services to youth from the Wellington rural areas. Services include:

- computer centre where youth receives training in MS Windows, Word and Excel;
- soccer team for children who do not have the opportunity to belong to formal soccer clubs;
- personal development programmes to youth who dropped out of school. This rehabilitation programme includes spiritual, educational and occupational skills development.

Who is NORSA ?

NORSA Community Care was established during 2006. The organisation is a NGO functioning as a section 21 company with registration number 2006/021925/08.

Our focus is to develop community based projects with specific focus on women in need, as well as families & children infected/affected with HIV/AIDS, TB & extreme poverty.

To address the above needs, we have developed two community centres in the townships of De Doorns & Wellington in the Western Cape where the prevalence of HIV/AIDS, TB & poverty is very high.



We are totally dependent on donations to sustain the services we are currently rendering.



Our projects

Cluster Care Programme

Cluster care is a community based programme where families and children, infected/affected with HIV/AIDS, are educated and monitored. Fifteen families are registered in a group (cluster) A childcare worker is appointed for every cluster.

Cluster families receive the following services:

- *pre-school child is cared for in daycare centre;*
- *family receives monthly food parcel;*
- *weekly visit from childcare worker;*
- *schoolgoing children are provided with school clothes and other school necessities.*



Early Learning Centres

All the pre-school children within our cluster families are cared for in our day care centres in Wellington and De Doorns. We are currently caring for a total number of 140 pre-school children (babies - 5 years).

These children are either HIV infected or orphaned and exposed to deprived circumstances. They are in need of adequate care, nutrition and stimulation programmes.



More projects

Soup Kitchens

To address the needs of the bigger communities, we established 3 soup kitchens in the different areas we are involved with.

We are currently providing soup to approximately 850-900 individuals on a daily basis. For some of them this is their only meal for the day.



Foster Homes

Residential care for children infected with HIV, HIV orphans, abandoned children, etc., is a very big need in the areas we are involved with. This motivated us to establish foster homes in the community where we accommodate up to 6 children with a house mother in a foster home.

It provides the children with the opportunity to be part of a family within their environment & culture. We take full responsibility for the care of these children (nutrition, medical care, clothing, etc).
